



# A SECOND HELPING of STEWARDSHIP

Here are a few thought-provoking questions to explore your thoughts and experiences with stewardship:

\*What does stewardship mean to you and why is it important? (This is an excerpt from my final paper for class: Stewardship is caretaking of the resources, gifts, and blessings the Lord has given us and returning and offering back to the Lord what is already His with grateful hearts. Stewardship allows us to celebrate what has so generously been entrusted to us as children of God. As farmers, my husband and I feel a deep stewardship with the land we have been entrusted with, not just for the bounty it provides but for the opportunity to nurture its water, soil, air, and native plants. We faithfully tend our land with practices that will enrich and rejuvenate, not merely use and deplete for maximum yields.)

- \*What is an interest or passion you have that God might be inviting you to steward in a new way?
- \*Who is someone that you have learned generosity and stewardship from? (I can imagine there are some wonderful stories here! Please share!)
- \*What is the earliest experience with money that you remember? (For me it was the tooth fairy, the Sunday School offering envelopes that were tallied every week, and my Grandpa Espeland dropping coins in the clover for us to find. If we found a four-leaf clover, we got \$1.00!) I would relish hearing some of your responses to this question!
- \*How were your attitudes and behaviors about money shaped by your mother, father or grandparents?
- \*What is your happiest and unhappiest memory with money? (My happiest memory was when I started earning my own money by mowing lawns, babysitting and washing dishes. My unhappiest memory was being the most expensive kid in our family.) Again, I would like to hear yours!
- \*How does your faith guide you in your use of money?
- \*Martha Moore Keish has a 2018 YouTube video entitled "Rethinking Stewardship" that follows the giving practices of the church since the beginning of time. Extremely interesting!

# **FYI FROM the Prairie Coteau Conference Assembly**

- \*South Dakota Synod has campus ministries on six campuses in SD.
- \*Lutherans Outdoors will once again offer travel experiences for adults. These will include Minneapolis for a play and baseball game, the Upper Peninsula of Michigan in September, the Smoky Mountains and Dollywood in October, and Branson in November. They are still in need of staff for summer camps which run from May 26-August 13. Must be 18 years or older.
- \*Kristi will be serving on the Evangelical Outreach Committee, which works with our Neighbors in Solidarity.
- \*Pastor Janet reported on the Companion Synods still needing roofs. Over \$500,000 has been raised in the past 20 years.
- \*Pastor Jeff from St. Dysmas reported on a program called *Strengthening Families* in partnership with Lutheran Social Services to work with children of the imprisoned. He also encouraged us to contact our legislators to ensure the new prison being planned contains a chapel, a true sacred space to worship, not just a multipurpose room. Prisoners involved with St. Dysmas have a 12% recidivism rate while non-worshipers have a 47% recidivism rate.
- \*One of our Neighbors in Solidarity, Woyatan Lutheran Church of Rapid City, has a congregation of 60 that feeds 400 people daily. They worship daily before every meal. This undertaking requires approximately 50 volunteers.
- \*Box Elder is the 10<sup>th</sup> largest town in SD and has only 1 church. With the Air Force Expansion and the Amazon warehouse coming, the Synod is looking to start a church there, which would become our 12<sup>th</sup> Neighbor in Solidarity.
