

Dear Friends in Christ,

I am writing this after coming off a difficult week, due to the removal of a wisdom tooth and another tooth that the wisdom tooth's nerves had wrapped around. (GLUP) Back to campus and rotating activities, supper, and our last activity, a concert. (GLUP) We were all inspired yet tired by this time as witnessed by our slow walk to my vehicle. We stopped for gas and snacks, and I bought a cup of caffeine in case my passengers dozed off on the way home. And then Remi asked if we could jam to some tunes on the way home. (GLUP) And it just so happens Tucker can name any song after hearing the first few notes. (GLUP)

We made our way home under a beautiful sky on an unusually mild February night. (GLUP) We arrived safely home, longing and thankful for the gift of our awaiting beds. (GLUP). The cherry on top of this tough week was worship and coffee at Butler the next morning. Peace~ Kristi

#### I Samuel 10 :7

This was our theme verse for the day, and participants were organized according to various signs; we were in the stop sign group. Opening worship consisted of several stations.

\*Newspaper prayers – Students were to locate an area article that resonated with them and ask God to be present with us in times of need and celebration. This has us calling on God to listen and be among the community affected.

\*Confessing fears – God asks us to trust in Him, offering up our fears, worries, and anxieties. God promises to be with us whenever we are worried, scared, or stressed. Students were encouraged to write a fear on a poster.

\*Ask a question – What questions do you have about God? What questions do you want to ask God? Write your questions on a Post-it note.

\*Map prayers – Conflicts and celebrations are occurring all over the world. As siblings to all people, we ask God to care for those who live far away from us. Think of other states and countries in need of prayer.

\*Called to follow – God calls us to follow him as we are and with whatever unique talents, abilities, and personalities we possess. Think of your defining features and qualities and record them on a note for the wall. Reflect on what makes each and every one of us special. Know that you are worthy no matter what you bring to the table.

\*Listening to God – God comes into our lives in mysterious ways and at mysterious times. Where do you see God in your life? How do you see God in your friends, family, and classmates? Draw or write about places you have felt God's presence.

\*Moving forward with Christ – God wants us to be rooted in His love and strengthened by the Holy Spirit inside and out. How do you see God fitting into your future goals? What goals do you think God has for you? **Our service project took place at Faith Temple Food Giveaway.** Their building is located on the north side of the fair grounds. Information about this organization:

\*Started in 2009 by Josh Hayes – acquired a permanent building in 2013.

\*The most bags distributed on a single Friday is 1,700. People come from a 60-mile radius to pick up food.

\*It takes approximately \$5,000 and 100 volunteers every Friday. They only take 2 Fridays off a year.

\*They have a partnership with DoorDash, which helps them deliver to people in the food deserts of Sioux Falls. DoorDash made 10,000 deliveries for them last year.

\*On the average, 3 to 4 people are served from each bag distributed.

\*FTFG works with 911 and 211 services to get food to those in need 24/7.

Jason Freeman, speaker at one of the sessions, posed this question to everyone, *How might the things you're struggling with be part of the miracle that is you?* Jason suffered oxygen deprivation when he was born, which resulted in a significant speech impediment. He admitted that at first he asked, *Why me? Why would God do this to me?* With supportive parents telling him he was the best, he turned that question into, *Why not me? And what can I do with this?* Jason decided to concentrate on the things he could do. He now travels the country speaking, and he is an author and podcaster. This was an inspiring session!

We ended our day with a concert by *Tangled Blue* in the chapel. These musicians had us up on our feet with hands in the air dancing to the glory of God.


