

#### **Special Congregational Meeting**

Your councils are calling a special congregational meeting to be held on November 1 at 10:00 for Bethesda, and November 8 at 10:00 for Butler. This meeting will convene in the sanctuary after worship.

Reminder that when a special congregational meeting is called the only topic up for discussion is the topic that is published as the reason for the meeting. All other business will be out of order and will either need to be addressed to your particular council or at the annual meeting. Thus this should be a short meeting.

The reason for this meeting is to discuss and amend our constitutions by inserting the following resolution:

#### Resolution

Be it resolved that *(insert congregation name)* amend the Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions by addition of C10.08 of the Model Constitution for Congregations, stating: **C10.08.** This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication. To the extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically.

What this allows us to do is to hold our annual meeting online if we need to. If we have to postpone our meeting because of weather which we have done in the past we will postpone it. We are adding this in the chance that Covid or some other disaster happens that keeps us from gathering in person for weeks on end, then we can still hold our meeting and get our business done.
