





Therefore, dear Easter people, let us cling to the promise that nothing, absolutely nothing will ever be able to separate us from the love of God. Thanks be to God!

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead ..." -1 Peter 1.3a

A good friend of mine, who happens to be a Benedictine Nun, once said to me: "If we believe that Jesus Christ was raised from the dead, then we can believe that an incarcerated person can have new life." She and I did prison ministry together for 9 years, and our trust and belief in the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, kindled in us a living hope that God creates a way where there doesn't seem to be one.

How might you or your congregation finish this sentence:

"If we believe that Jesus Christ was raised from the dead, then ..."

I invite you to ponder this phrase this season of Easter, and trust in God's great mercy that gives you a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

Perplexed

According to the NRSV translation of Luke's Easter story, the women are "perplexed" at the empty tomb. They have come expecting to grieve and instead are confused at what God has already done.

I believe that in our lives, we also are perplexed when we encounter resurrection. When we expect brokenness, pain, or death, God has often already shown up to bring community, comfort, or new life. As the world rages around us, I invite you to recognize those moments of resurrection we encounter here and now in our churches.

Although the pandemic has changed so much of our lives, as churches we have recognized the importance of community, of being in relationship with one another, and the blessings God offers us through people. Although the National Youth Gathering was canceled, congregations are pivoting to still give meaningful experiences to young people. Even as war and conflict occur in the world, our churches proclaim the Gospel of peace, love, and grace through Christ.

I pray that you will be perplexed at what God is up to, that where you expect things to look down, you instead find abundant life. The Holy Spirit is up to incredible things in our world, our communities, our churches, and your life. Resurrection abounds, and that is Good News indeed!

Generosity = Easter Evangelism Kathy McHenry

Chris Willard and Jim Sheppard share some thoughts in their book, Contagious Generosity (2012), worth repeating this Easter season:

"This is about generosity, not about fundraising. If all we're working toward is funding budgets or meeting campaign goals, we will have missed something along the way. Following Jesus means learning how to follow him in every area of our lives, including how we handle our money.

"The truth is that God doesn't need our gifts, but knows that our attitude toward generosity reflects our obedience to the lordship of Christ and how well we grasp that God is the source of all we have. As followers of Christ, our goal in life is not gaining power, possession or prestige for ourselves. We exist, along with the entire body of Christ, to fulfill the Great Commission until Christ's return. When we act with generosity to serve others, it is a clear picture of Christ, who at the cross generously gave his life and all that he had so that we might have life forever [emphasis added]." (p. 165-166, paraphrased)

In a world filled with need and uncertainty, Jesus offers an alternative economic theory that celebrates sharing,

with no coercion or guilt or political agenda. When we act in ways that reflect our commitment to Christ, this fearful, watching world notices. May God grant each of us the generosity of open eyes, willing hearts and obedient hands that become Easter evangelism.
