- I will use our Facebook page to post a video of my Sunday message each week. I will also work
 with Liz to see if it can be placed on our Website. I am experimenting with you tube and
 podcast as a means to connect with the confirmation students.
- Pastoral Care: Call me or text me 605-218-0852 if you need to talk or have a prayer request. I am trying to figure out the best way to reach our members who are in SunDial. Will continue to see people in their homes if they are Ok with that.

This type of ministry is new to me and I am in conversation with our Bishop and her staff weekly among attending other webinars to learn how to be Pastor in this new environment.

I will continue to come into church on Wednesdays and will be available then for 1 on 1 in person conversations.



Sanford Webster Bridging Health and Home Program March 2020

March is colorectal cancer awareness month. Colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer in the United States and the second leading cause of death from cancer.

Risk factors for colon cancer include:

- *People age 50 or older
- *Family history of colorectal cancer or polyps
- *Personal history of type 2 diabetes, Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis
- *Being overweight
- *Lack of physical activity
- *Alcohol consumption
- *Smoking
- *Eating a low fiber, high fat diet

The good news is colorectal cancer is almost 100% curable if caught early. You can help prevent colon cancer by getting screened regularly starting at age 50 and encouraging your friends and family members to get screened. Talk with your doctor about what screening method is appropriate for you. Other ways to prevent colon cancer include quitting smoking and avoiding secondhand smoke, getting plenty of physical activity and eating a diet that includes plenty of fruits, vegetables and whole grains.

February is American Heart Month

- Heart disease is the leading cause of death for both men & women
- Each year in the US about 715,000 people have a heart attack
- 600,000 American die from heart disease annually
- Overall cost of heart disease each year is \$300 billion

Did you know? Myth's vs. Fact's

- I'm too young to worry about heart disease
 - o How you live now affects your risk for heart disease later in life
- I'd know if I had high blood pressure because of the warning signs
 High blood pressure is called the "silent killer", you may not know
- I'll know if I am having a heart attack, because I'll have chest pain
 - o Other symptoms include shortness of breath, nausea, arm/jaw pain
- Diabetes doesn't affect my heart, as long as I take my medication
 Even well controlled blood sugars increase risk for heart disease
- Heart disease runs in my family, there is nothing I can do about it
 - o Risk can be reduced with activity, diet and avoidance of tobacco
- · Pain in my legs is a sign of aging, nothing to do with my heart
 - o Leg pain may be caused by blocked arteries in the legs

Way to reduce my risk

- Quit smoking
- Limit alcohol
- · Healthy foods

- Reduce stress
- Lower Blood pressure/cholesterol

Personal Care Kits.


Butler will serve the Lenten Supper on March 11th.
