Hello Everyone,

Welcome to Lent, that time of the year when we purposely set aside time to reflect on our lives. Remembering that we are human which means that at some point we will die. As we examine our lives we might choose to make changes either by giving something up or beginning something new. Making the changes in order to better align ourselves with our faith and with God.

As you ponder these changes in your life I invite you to come to worship Wednesday evenings where we will gather together in fellowship and learning. This year our Lenten journey to the cross will take us through the trial of Jesus. Not the trial that is given to us in the Bible but one that seeks to answer the question of: Who is this Jesus...for you?

The jury has been selected and the jury is you, all of you. The witnesses have been gathered, we will hear from six of them. Matthew who will speak to us about Jesus's scandalous association with the seedier side of society. A person who will not be named to safeguard their identity will give evidence of Jesus breaking the Sabbath law by healing, doing work on that sacred day. Nicodemus, a prominent Jewish leader, a Pharisee, will give testimony to Jesus, a disturber of the peace. Another nameless woman who was caught in the act of committing adultery and how Jesus once again flaunted the law by acting as both Judge and Jury in her defense. John who gives testimony that Jesus claims he is the bread of Life and that we should eat him? Is that cannibalism? The last witness will be Mary of Magdelena who will tell all. Can't wait to hear what she has to say.

Two thousand years ago Jesus was on trial before the High Priest Caiaphas and then Pontius Pilate where he was found guilty and was crucified. Through his death Jesus has redeemed the world, making all things new through him.

Today Jesus is still on trial. His saving act, his being in the world, his message of radical love, all demand a response. Every human heart must wrestle with questions like: Who is this Jesus? Is he who he claims to be? If so, what does that mean for me and how I live my life? What is your answer? What is your verdict?

The trial has begun, opening remarks were made on Ash Wednesday, after all the evidence, after all the witnesses have been heard, what will be the verdict? Come and see.

# **Butler WELCA**


