Our most fun stage of grandparenting currently is Halsten wanting to come and stay at our house for a few days. This offers endless opportunities for funny and eye-opening conversations. One morning we completed a heart transplant on his toy dog using his vet set by 7:30 A.M. My sewing room became the recovery room, and the patient was monitored for 30 minutes. "All grown-ups were once children...although few of them remember it. " This quote from *The Little Prince* hits home. We seem to lose our child-like wonder as we age. Whenever the first snow falls, I note how it excites kids, and I have to admit to its beauty. But the easiest thing to do is grumble, wondering what is in store for the coming months.

I want for my grandson what I wanted for my children- to be happy, healthy, and know the love of the Lord. It is what I want for you also. This world can be a bit rough and tough on us, but if we know to call upon the One that is always there, with us, we can weather the storms. If we can remember the gift of baptism that bestows an eternal identity – chosen, forgiven, child of God – then we never have to remind ourselves who we are. So, let your faith shine through to all but especially to the young people in your life. Don't be shy in letting them know what your faith has done and continues to do for you. See how many conversations you can bring God into, reminding them who they are, first and foremost. Blessings for 2024!
