From the Bishop's Desk

Dear SD Synod,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit!

Driving across the State I can see that we are pretty dry. I pray for rain and moisture to water our parched lands. I also lift up prayers for our ranchers and farmers. It's not only the land that is parched, but spirits can run dry too. You may remember that in the very first months of my term you were invited to a farm summit in Mitchell SD. We shared in the joys and challenges of farming and ranching, learned about resources, and were assured that God's always close at hand. At the same time of the farm summit, I also collaborated with Lutheran Social Services in SD. We partnered to offer Mental Health First Aid training to our leaders so that they can learn about the first signs of distress. But we also developed a web-based tool called Psychological First Aid. It is designed with your neighbor in mind. You can take this web-based training at your pace and at your time. It strives to equip you with what you need to read early warning signs of mental health issues, and gives you tools to be a good neighbor to your neighbor. Last but not least, many ask about how to best support the Ukrainian refugees. At this time your monetary gifts to Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) or Lutheran World Relief (LWR) are the best help you can provide as they aid relief efforts on the ground. Our ministry partner LSS is in close communication with the federal government to see how to best assist refugees that will find their way to the United States. Watch your e-news for regular updates.

"Do not fear..."

When we are anxious about the future, we place our trust in God. There is hardly a more anxious time for a congregation than when it is without a pastor. Yet, times of transition are part of the cycle of life in a congregation. It is a wilderness time when we fully lean on God and the Spirit's guidance. We do the same as Synod staff, as your partner in ministry. When I look at the "accepting names" section on our call process page on our website, it could be easy to be overwhelmed and discouraged. Where will the pastors and deacons come from, Lord? How will you sustain ministry in your Church?

But then I am reminded of the words of God in the book of Isaiah, chapter 41, verse 10:

"Do not fear, for I am with you,

do not be afraid, for I am your God;

I will strengthen you, I will help you,

I will uphold you with my victorious right hand."

These words of promise are meant to assure us of God's presence and help. We need not fear the future for God is with us. Even in times of transition, ministry happens and the Gospel is proclaimed! People step up and realize they may have gifts they have never discovered, and we get creative about ways we do ministry and find leadership. Know that those of us who serve in the Synod office are constantly remembering you in prayer and are working on ways to sustain ministry, especially in our more remote congregations. Pr. Alan Blakenfeld's call is one way we are doing this.

As I look back at 2021, I see that we had 38 Ministry Site Studies, and in turn issued 38 letters of call as a synod. That doesn't mean that every open call was filled, and some congregations certainly wait longer than others, but it does mean that God is faithful and calls are happening.

If and when you or your congregation is anxious, turn again to these words and promise from God:

"Do not fear, for I am with you,

do not be afraid, for I am your God;

I will strengthen you, I will help you,

I will uphold you with my victorious right hand."

Winter, Spring, Winter, Spring...

Hopefully, when you read this it will be Spring! We all need spring, maybe this year more than others. When I was farming spring was the time of new beginnings, working in the field and smelling the newly stirred soil was always great. Planting and then waiting for the seeds to sprout and come forth, however, this was also a stressful time until the rows of young plants could be seen. With the new growth comes renewed hope. The same can be said for our rural congregations, we are living out our various calls within our churches, but when we face times of transition there is fear of the unknown. Rural ministry is very important and vital to our communities, the Bishop and the Synod know that and will walk with you in times of transition. Change in our rural areas and within rural congregations can be times of stress but know that you are not alone. The Holy Spirit is at work! Rural ministry and the way that ministry is done may look different than you are used to but that doesn't mean the ministry will suffer but rather that it has renewed hope.
